

Track 2: Discipline Honors Scholar

Track 2 is designed for first-year students who have a significant number of transfer credits that fulfill the University's general education requirements (All University Core Curriculum or AUCC) in Written Communication, Additional Communication, Arts/Humanities, Social/Behavioral Sciences, Historical Perspectives, Global and Cultural Awareness, and U.S. Public Values and Institutions.

Track 2 is a 17 credit program of studies that consists of a 1 credit Freshman seminar (Honors), 16 credits of upper-division Honors courses in the major/discipline, including the Honors pre-thesis and senior Honors thesis. The diagram below depicts Track 2 requirements.

Track 2: Discipline Honors Scholar

IU 193H, Freshman Seminar (Honors)	1 credit
3-4 Honors courses in the major/discipline	12 credits
HP 399, Honors Pre-Thesis	1 credit
HP 499, Senior Honors Thesis	3 credits

Students who complete Track 2 with at least a 3.5 cumulative GPA receive the designation of Discipline Honor Scholars (e.g., History Honors Scholar or Biology Honors Scholar). Track 2 Honors students receive the same benefits as Track 1 students. They are eligible to live in Newsom Residence Hall, join the Honors Student Association (HSA), attend and participate in all Honors events sponsored by the Honors Program and HSA, enroll in special Honors sections of regular courses, apply for Honors Program enrichment awards, receive advising in the Honors Program office, and register early for courses.
